# A Brief History

The Savannah College of Art and Design was founded in 1978 by Richard G. Rowan, Paula S. Wallace, Paul E. Poetter, and May L. Poetter to provide degree programs not previously available in southeast Georgia and to create a specialized professional art college to attract students from throughout the U.S. and abroad. The curriculum was established with dual goals of excellent arts education and effective career preparation for students. Today, with degree-granting locations in Atlanta and Savannah, Georgia; a study abroad location in Lacoste, France; and online programs offered through SCADnow, SCAD continues to assiduously adhere to these goals.

SCAD was legally incorporated in the state of Georgia on Sept. 29, 1978. A Board of Trustees was established, and the search began for a credentialed faculty and an appropriate facility.

In the spring of 1979, SCAD purchased and renovated the Savannah Volunteer Guards Armory to serve as the first classroom and administration building. The historic significance of the 1892 structure was recognized by its nomination for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. Named Poetter Hall in honor of two SCAD founders, the building remains in active use by SCAD today.

Classes began in September 1979 with 71 students and 11 faculty and staff members. Today, the student body numbers more than 17,000 and the faculty and staff more than 2,000. SCAD Savannah encompasses nearly 80 buildings, equipped with the latest technology, located throughout the city's historic and Victorian districts.

In 2002, the university concluded an agreement with the Lacoste School of the Arts (France) under which the school donated its historic properties to SCAD. The Lacoste site consists of more than 30 buildings in a remarkably preserved medieval village in Provence and has been designated by the French government as a national treasure. Varied courses that apply to all SCAD areas of study are offered at Lacoste throughout the year.

In Fall 2003, SCAD eLearning was launched, offering degree programs and certificates completely online under the authority and accreditation of the university. Among other recognitions,

SCAD was the first art and design university to receive the Instructional Technology Council's award for Outstanding Distance Education Program and the rank of Excellence in Institution-Wide Online Teaching and Learning from the Online Learning Consortium. Rebranded as SCADnow in 2021, the university's signature online learning platform offers on-the-go artists, designers, and professionals the best of both worlds in distance education — real-time engagement combined with on-demand access.

In March 2005, SCAD opened a location in Midtown Atlanta at the center of the fast-paced major U.S. metropolis. Atlanta offers students access to internships and employment opportunities with major arts organizations and leading companies. In addition to SCAD Atlanta's main building, facilities include a digital media center, an acclaimed sculpture and design studio, and the historic Ivy Hall.

In August 2005, the Board of Trustees of the Woodruff Arts Center and SCAD voted to approve an agreement between the Atlanta College of Art and the university. ACA was integrated into SCAD beginning June 2006.

In 2009, the Hong Kong Development Bureau entrusted SCAD with conserving the historic North Kowloon Magistracy Building in Sham Shui Po to become the leading site for the study of art and design in Asia. Classes began Fall 2010 and, following the conclusion of SCAD's 10-year lease with the Hong Kong government, the university decided to discontinue the location and focus on its offerings in Atlanta and Savannah, Georgia; Lacoste, France, and online via SCADnow.

At each location, students are nurtured and motivated by faculty members with extraordinary academic credentials and valuable professional experience. These professors emphasize learning through individual attention in an inspiring university environment. The innovative SCAD curriculum is enhanced by advanced professional-level technology, equipment, and learning resources. SCAD offers an exceptional education and unparalleled career preparation, with 99% of Spring 2022 SCAD alumni employed, pursuing further education, or both within 10 months of graduation.

# Accreditation

## **Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges**

The Savannah College of Art and Design is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to award baccalaureate and masters degrees. Savannah College of Art and Design also may offer credentials such as certificates and diplomas at approved degree levels. Questions about the accreditation of the Savannah College of Art and Design may be directed in writing to the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges at 1866 Southern Lane, Decatur, GA 30033-4097, by calling (404) 679-4500, or by using information available on SACSCOC's website ([www.sacscoc.org](http://www.sacscoc.org)).

The SCAD department of institutional effectiveness is responsible for reporting substantive changes to SACSCOC according to the Commission's published policies. Faculty and staff can email [accreditation@scad.edu](mailto:accreditation@scad.edu) to report or request information regarding substantive change.

## **National Architectural Accrediting Board**

In the United States, most registration boards require a degree from an accredited professional degree program as a prerequisite for licensure. The National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), which is the sole agency authorized to accredit professional degree programs in architecture offered by institutions with U.S. regional accreditation, recognizes three types of degrees: the Bachelor of Architecture, the Master of Architecture, and the Doctor of Architecture. A program may be granted an eight-year term, an eight-year term with conditions, or a two-year term of continuing accreditation, or a three-year term of initial accreditation, depending on the extent of its conformance with established education standards.

Doctor of Architecture and Master of Architecture degree programs may require a non-accredited undergraduate degree in architecture for admission. However, the non-accredited degree is not, by itself, recognized as an accredited degree.

The Savannah College of Art and Design School of Building Arts offers the following NAAB-accredited degree program(s): M.Arch. (180 undergraduate credits plus 90 graduate credits). Next accreditation visit: 2030.

## **Council for Interior Design Accreditation**

The interior design program leading to the Bachelor of Fine Arts in interior design at SCAD Atlanta and SCAD Savannah is accredited by the Council for Interior Design Accreditation, [www.accredit-id.org](http://www.accredit-id.org), 206 Cesar E. Chavez Ave. SW, Suite 350, Grand Rapids, MI, 49503.

The CIDA-accredited program prepares students for entry-level interior design practice, for advanced study, and to apply for membership in professional interior design organizations. The Bachelor of Fine Arts in interior design granted by the Savannah College of Art and Design meets the educational requirement for eligibility to sit for the National Council for Interior Design Qualification Examination (NCIDQ exam). 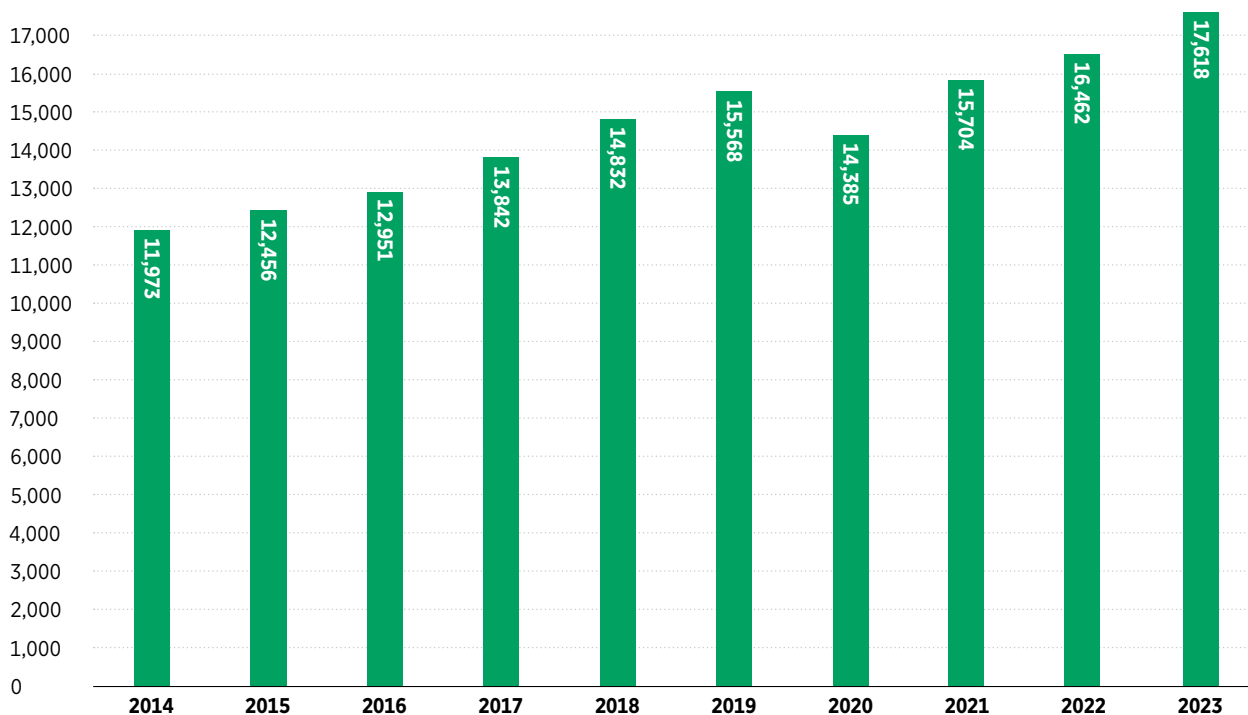
